Lifting Up The

"When the enemy shall come in like a flood, the Spirit of the LORD shall lift up a standard against him" (Isaiah 59:19).

"IF" - "Then" And "When"

The word "if" occurs 1,595 times in the Word of God, and introduces a condition that includes one or more requirements.

The word "then" occurs 2,168 times, pointing to something taking place as a result of our action concerning meeting or not meeting the requirements of the "if."

The word "when" is found 2,847 times, pointing to a specific time when something will take place.

The first time "if" occurs we read,

"If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted?" (Genesis 4:7).

The first time the word "then" occurs is found in Genesis 3:5,

"In the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods."

The first time the word "when" occurs in the Scriptures is found in Genesis 2:4,

"These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created."

The Three "Ifs" Of Spiritual Understanding Proverbs 2:1-2,

"My son, **if** thou wilt receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee; So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to <u>understanding</u>."

Proverbs 2:3.

"Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding."

Proverbs 2:3-4,

"**If** thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for hid treasures; Then shalt thou <u>understand</u>..."

God's Conditional Offer

"if" we will "receive" His words, and "hide" His commandments in our heart (V.1).

"if" we will "incline" our ear unto wisdom (V.2).

"if" we will "apply" our heart to understanding (V.2).

"Receive My Words"

To receive something is to take delivery of something. In this case it has to do with receiving what God is communicating, and simply requires a choice. Many professed Christians refuse to make a decision to receive His instructions and His commandments and hide them in their heart. When I was saved back in 1955, preachers called that apostasy; today, we call it fundamentalism.

"Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." (Psalm 119:11)

"Open thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of thy law." (Psalm 119:18)

"These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so."

(Acts 17:11)

Following The Instructions To Understanding

Proverbs 1:2, Receiving "instruction."

"To know wisdom and instruction; to perceive the words of understanding."

The Hebrew word translated *instruction* here is *muwcar*. It has been translated *correction* eight times.

Proverbs 1:7, Despising "instruction."

"Fools despise wisdom and instruction." (correction).

Wisdom is having the God-given ability to make right judgments. To correct something is to change something we are doing wrong.

Proverbs 12:1,

"Whoso loveth instruction (correction) loveth knowledge: but he that hateth reproof is brutish."

God's People Refused to Receive Correction

Jeremiah 5:3,

"They have <u>refused to receive correction</u>: they have made their faces harder than a rock; they have refused to return."

Jeremiah 7:28,

"This is a nation that obeyeth not the voice of the LORD their God, nor receiveth correction."

Hiding His Commandments

The Hebrew word translated "hide" in this verse is tsaphan. The same word is used in Psalm 119: 11 where we read, "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." The phrase "with thee" in Proverbs 2:1 refers to hiding or treasuring up His commandments in our heart.

Inclining Our Ear Unto Wisdom

The word <u>incline</u> in Proverbs 2:2 has been translated <u>harken</u> twenty-seven times. The dictionary says to be <u>inclined</u> is "to be <u>willingly minded toward an action, belief, or attitude.</u>" Once again, this simply requires a decision to be <u>willing minded concerning</u> the things that God has to say to us. It is to make the choice to pay attention to the Word of God.

Knowledge is the accumulation of information, whereas, wisdom is the ability to make good judgments concerning the information we have received.

For example, we have two little children in our church. One is a really cute baby, a few months old, who has very little knowledge about life. He is a little bundle of joy; however, he is not capable of making any judgments concerning Life. He has a brother named Jed, who is two years old. In his short life he has developed the ability to make some judgments. The other day, Jed's mother told him to get ready to go to church. He went into his bedroom and came out wearing a hat and his snow boots; however, he was also only wearing his underwear. This was a poor judgment; however, he is only two years old. If a teenager made the same judgment, we would conclude something was missing concerning the ability to judge what is right and what is wrong.

Television can be a powerful influence in developing value systems and shaping behaviour in our children or the Word of God can be a powerful influence in developing value systems and shaping behaviour in our children.

Apply Our Heart To Understanding

To apply oneself to understanding is to give one's full attention to understanding what God wants us to comprehend. The word heart in this verse has been translated mind twelve times. Moses said, "Hereby ye shall know that the LORD hath sent me to do all these works; for I have not done them of mine own mind" (Numbers 16:28).

The Second "If" of Spiritual Understanding

Proverbs 2:3,

"Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding."

The word criest in this verse has been translated call 528 times. Below are a few examples.

Psalm 91:15,

"Call...I will answer."

Proverbs 50:15,

"Call upon me in the day of trouble... I will deliver thee."

Jeremiah 29:12,

"Call upon me...I will harken unto you."

The Third "If" of Spiritual Understanding

Proverbs 2:4,

"If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for hid treasures."

The word <u>seek</u> has been translated <u>require</u> fourteen times and <u>enquire</u> three times. To search is to try to find something by throughly looking for it as we would for hid treasure. A treasure is something considered very valuable.

The "Then" of Spiritual Understanding

Proverbs 2:5,

"Then shalt thou understand the fear of the LORD, and find the knowledge of God."

The word understand has been translated <u>perceive</u> seven times and translated <u>discern</u> three times.

Understanding The Fear of God



We have a promise from almighty God that we can "understand the fear of the Lord;" however, only "when" the requirements are met. He said, "Then shalt thou understand the fear of the LORD,"

Finding The Knowledge of God

We also have the promise that we can "find the knowledge of God." God has all the information we need about every circumstance of life. It is available to us if we receive His words, hide His commandments in our hearts, incline our ear to wisdom, apply our heart to understanding, cry after knowledge, pray for understanding, and seek understanding. "**Then** thou shalt understand..." (v.5).
