



You Can't Make Them Drink!

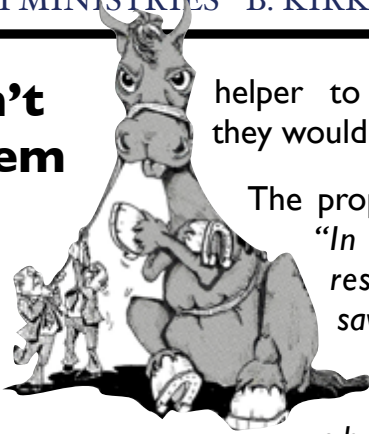
Paul spent his life as a Christian with one major purpose and that was to help others. Writing to the Corinthians he said it was his desire *“that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God”* (Second Corinthians 1:4).

To the Corinthians, Paul said *“I wrote unto you with many tears...that ye might know the love which I have more abundantly unto you.”* He continued *“I have said before, that ye are in our hearts to die and live with you”* (Second Corinthians 7:3).

Paul continued saying *“And I will very gladly spend and be spent for you; though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved”* (Second Corinthians 12:15).

“Ye Would Not”

The phrase **“would not”** is in the Word of God 118 times. The phrase **“ye would not,”** came from the lips of Moses four times. He wanted to be a



helper to their joy but they would not listen.

The prophet Isaiah said, *“In returning and rest shall ye be saved; in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength: and **ye would not**”* (Isaiah 30:15).

The prophet Jeremiah said, *“Because they have not hearkened to my words, saith the LORD, which I sent unto them by my servants the prophets, rising up early and sending them; but **ye would not** hear, saith the LORD”* (Jeremiah 29:19).

Jesus said, *“O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and **ye would not!**”*

In John 5:40 Jesus said, *“**ye will not** come to me, that ye might have life.”*

They Must Choose

It is discouraging for a pastor or a parent when the people they care about refuse to listen; however, they must make their own

choices and face the consequences of their choices.

“A Heaviness of Heart And Continual Sorrow”

Paul said *“I have great heaviness and continual sorrow in my heart...for my brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh.”* (Romans 9:1-3).

Paul also said, *“Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I am pure from the blood of all men. For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God”* (Acts 20:26).

We must realize that we do not have *“dominion over the faith”* of our listeners we are simply *helpers of their joy*” (Second Corinthians 1:24).
