THE TRUTH ABOUT REPENTANCE

Just prior to leaving this world Christ promised us that we can "know the truth" (John 8:32). In this article we will discuss the truth about repentance.

Jesus said, "I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3). Knowing that so-called fundamentalists, at the end of the age, would promote the "damnable heresy" that repentance is the enemy of soul winning, Christ repeated it so that sincere Bible believing Christians would not miss it. He said again, "I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:5).

How People Are Saved

First Corinthians 1:21,

"It pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe."

First Corinthians 1:18,

"For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God." Issue 39 - October 27, 2014

"And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations." (Luke 24:47)

The Word of God

The Greek word translated "preaching" has been translated "speech" eight times and "saying" fifty times.

It might be as a result of a message preached or by one person witnessing that one would come to a saving knowledge of Christ. The important thing is we are to "Preach the Word!" (Second Timothy 4:2).

The Holy Spirit

Again, just prior to Christ leaving this world He promised that the Holy Spirit would come.

John 16:8,

"And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment."

The Greek word translated "reprove" is translated "convicted" in John 8:9.

No Choice But To Choose

Deuteronomy 30:19,

"I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live."

The listener must respond. He, or she, must *repent* or *reject* the conviction brought about by the Word of God as the Holy Spirit reveals the truth of the the Word of God.

Repentance Is Not Remorse Second Corinthians 7:10,

"For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death."

First Samuel 24:26,
